CROCHET Tand Advanced

Exhibit Guidelines

Unit I exhibits should follow patterns as outlined in the Crochet Pattern Guide.

- 1. Unit 1 Scarf, cap or beret(choose one) using combination of single and double crochet stitches
- 2. Unit 1 Pillow using granny square design

Unit II exhibits should follow patterns as outlined in the Crochet Pattern Guide.

- 1. Unit 2 Potholder using basic crochet stitches and one or more pattern stitches
- 2. Unit 2 Decorative Stitch Pillow using basic stitches and one or more pattern stitches

Unit III exhibits can be a pattern of vour choice.

1. Unit 3 - An afghan, shawl, scarf or throw (choose one) using one or a combination of the following stitches: Afghan Stitch, Broomstick Lace, or Hairpin Lace
