Exhibit Guidelines

1. One scrapbook page in a 8.5' X 11" or 12 X 12" format
2. Two scrapbook pages in a 8.5" X 11" or 12" X 12" format that go together in a set (a two-page spread)
3. One completed theme album of any size
4. One completed gift album of any size
5. One covered photo album
6. One completed digital scrapbook – printed scrapbook using online digital scrapbooking software
7. Self-determined Advanced Scrapbooking exhibit including Self- Determined Record Sheet #300.SD-1

Project Overview

Scrapbooking is one of the fastest-growing hobbies and it keeps getting more and more popular each year! A scrapbook is basically a photo album that you put together using photographs and other items you wish to save, such as ticket stubs, greeting cards, certificates, and much, much more. To make it even more special, a scrapbook is usually decorated or embellished with papers of different colors, stickers, ribbons, buttons, or many other items.
