Exhibit Guidelines

- Sam the slinky snake:
 - the head connected to the first section with two eyelets 1 1/2" in from the outside
 - first and second section connected with two large snaps, 1 1/2" in from the outside edge
 - second and third section connected with self closing tape (velcro) 2 1/2" inches long
 - o third section and the tail are attached with two buttons 1 1/2" in from the outside edge
- Skirt and Top, Vest & skirt/pants, Top & skirt/pants, or Jumper & Top with the following quidelines
 - Pattern of choice using woven fabric. Must include 3 of the following:
 - Collar without a band
 - Faced neckline
 - Pockets
 - Interfacing in front placket/collar/facing
 Buttons and holes
 - · NO ZIPPER
