Project Overview

This project introduces members to the basics of embroidery including equipment, materials, steps, and stitches. Members follow this guide to complete Embroidery I, II, and III.

Key Learning Topics

- Correct use of equipment – needles, hoop, thimble and embroidery scissors.
- To read instructions and work a design.
- To use thread correctly – how to separate and recombine threads, length of use, how to start and end stitches.
- How work a pre stamped, transfer or chart design.
- How to finish project in an appropriate manner.

Expanding the Project

- Give a talk or demonstration about your embroidery project at your club or county contest.
- Teach another person one of your skills you've learned.
- Donate items created to a local nursing home or Senior Center during the holidays or any other opportunity that presents itself.
- Donate items created for a 4-H fundraiser.

 - a. include at 5 basic stitches using embroidery floss
2. Unit 1 – Embroidery article for your home
 - a. include at 5 basic stitches using embroidery floss
3. Unit 2 – Embroidery article meeting Unit 2 requirements
 - a. at least 10 basic stitches and 2 types of yarn
 - b. Original design with pattern attached.
 - c. Finished appropriately for the background used.
4. Unit 3 – An article using colcha
5. Unit 3 – An article using crewel
