



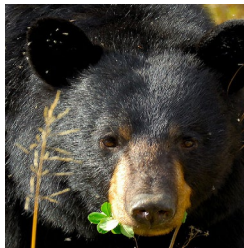

Suggested Activities:

- Give demonstrations or illustrated talks.
- Exhibit posters at county, regional or state fairs.
- Volunteer to clean a wildlife habitat like a forest, lake, or BLM.
- Give a prepared speech or demonstration on big game to your club or school.
- Attend events to listen to experts in the field.
- Help others prepare a speech or demonstration about wildlife.
- Complete a state record book (for Senior 4-H'ers).

Objectives: To teach basic wildlife habitat requirements and management concepts for big game species in New Mexico. While developing techniques, this project also allows 4-H'ers and their families, friends, and club to learn skills together.

- Enter project materials or demonstrations in the county, district or state contests and fairs.
- For the completion of the project, complete the record sheet and turn in a county record book to your local Extension Agent,
