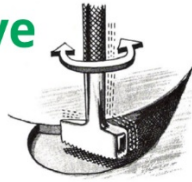


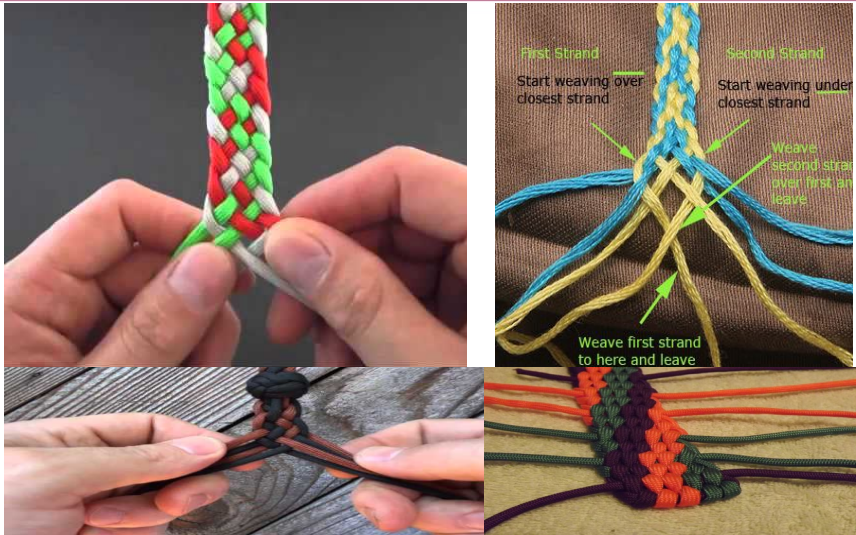

4-H Intermediate Braiding and Knotting Unit II – Greento 400.C-25 (R-18)



This is the second unit of **4-H Braiding and Knotting**. We will assume participants have already learned the basic skills needed for braiding as outlined in Unit I. Unit II then becomes a new and enriching experience as you learn to braid more intricate patterns.

What to enter in the Fair:

- Exhibit Board 14" X 20" X 1/8" or 1/4" preferably peg board, to which you attach:
 - Samples of basic braids shown in this unit
 - 5 Plait Braid
 - 6 Plait Braid
 - 6 Plait Split
 - 8 Plait Braid
 - 8 Plait Split
 - 10 Plait Braid
 - Your own design 8 Plait
 - Your own design 6 Plait
 - 4 Plait Loop End
 - Sisal 10 Plait with fluffed ends
 - Three completed articles of the following:
 - Any article of your choice as in the project manual.

Fasten each sample of the basic braids and articles to the exhibit board. Label each sample and article. On each article indicate if made from a kit or if you cut and designed it yourself. On the back of the exhibit board be sure and put your name, address, and county
