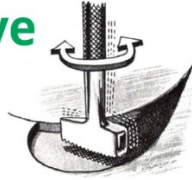

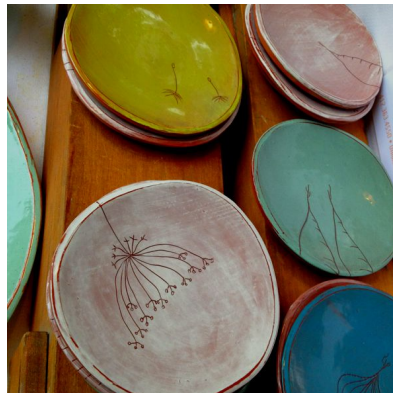

- Learn about using three types of clay
- Learn about Ceramic Tools for molding, cleaning, and painting
- Learn about Preparation of Ceramic Pieces
- Learn about Firing
- Learn terminology related to Ceramics

- Complete your Record Form, as a Senior you can submit a State 4-H Record Book in Ceramics or Creative Arts
- Share information about Ceramics with other groups or teach younger members the skills you have learned
- Give a demonstration on your 4-H Ceramics Project

- Make and donate ceramic items to the retirement or children's home
- Organize a trip to a local ceramics shop.

The 4-H Ceramics project is divided into six units. Members learn a variety of skills in each unit. Enrollment in the Ceramics Project makes a youth eligible to participate in any or all of the six units at any given time. It is recommended that units be completed in order.

- Unit I: Learn about types of Glazes and Glazing
- Unit II: Learn about Underglazing
- Unit III: Learn about Overglazing
- Unit IV: Learn about Unfired Finishes
- Unit V: Learn about Hand Molded Clay
- Unit VI: Learn about Greenware Application
