






## 4-H Fashion Magic- Wardrobe Planning- Greentop

The Fashion Magic projects are designed for Senior 4-H members who have an interest in clothing and a desire to learn more about successful dressing. This Fashion Magic: Wardrobe Planning project will help 4-H members learn to customize their clothing and select clothing that they enjoy wearing. The first Fashion Magic project, Wardrobe Planning, is the entry-level project and should be completed before any of the other two, In the Marketplace or Clothing Coordination. After completing this project you may select and complete the other two Fashion Magic projects in any order.

### Suggested steps for completing the Fashion Magic: Wardrobe Planning project:

- Review the project book and greentop to become familiar with the project before you begin to complete the charts and activities provided in the project book.
- Attend Fashion Magic: Wardrobe Planning project meetings.
- Complete the charts and activities provided in the project book and organize them into a notebook.
- Purchase, construct, acquire and/or recycle one or more garments and/or accessory items to complete at least one outfit based on your identified wardrobe needs and/or desires.
- Participate in the county or state Fashion Magic contest. You will need to model the garment(s) and/or accessory item(s) selected to complete an outfit for the Wardrobe Planning project and provide your completed notebook for an interview session with the judge(s).
- Exhibit your completed Fashion Magic: Wardrobe Planning notebook at the county achievement day, county fair, state fair, or regional fair.
- For completion of the Fashion Magic: Wardrobe Planning project, turn in a county record book that includes your finished project book charts and records to your local Extension Agent.

#### What can be done:

- Make an educational poster about your Fashion Magic: Wardrobe Planning
- Give a Fashion Magic: Wardrobe Planning project demonstration/illustrated talk at your club meeting.
- Visit a textile company or clothing manufacturer (could be a large company or a small local business).
- Attend and/or participate in a fashion show in local stores or 4-H clubs.
- Visit a fabric store to see what's new in fabrics.

- Serve as a project teen leader and help individual 4-H members with their clothing project.
- Organize a clothing and shoe drive for a homeless shelter, nursing home, church, abuse center, or other organization.
