The 4-H Rodeo Project involves youth and adults in all aspects of the 4-H program and rodeo events. Beginning in October, the 4-Hers enroll in a club and the 4-H rodeo project preparation begins. The individual life skills you will gain include responsibility for yourself and your animal, and a sense of self-assurance and self-esteem, ability to manage your time and a respect for your fellow contestants. The project years begins with clinics and workshops in the areas of first aid, event safety and philosophy of the 4-H program. The rodeo record book requires you to record expenses and income and also record your progress in both physical and mental achievements. Our challenge to you, as a rodeo competitor, is to make your best better!

Before Competing in Your First Rodeo:

- Enroll in Rodeo Project.
- Provide a notarized “Liability Waiver”.
- Have adequate health and/or accident insurance.
- Basic instructions and safety for events in which you are competing.
- If hauling a horse, obtain New Mexico Livestock Hauling Papers (brand certificate).

- Goat Tying
- Pole Bending
- Saddle Bronc Riding
- Steer Wrestling
- Team Roping

Citizenship Activities:

- Do a chore for someone who needs help.
- Personally collect clothing or canned goods for the needy.
- Help to plant trees, shrubbery, or flowers around churches, community buildings, and/or public places.
- Invite your state representative to speak to your 4-H Club or County Council.
