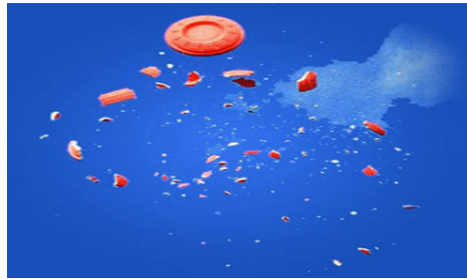




NM 4-H Shotgun Greentop

400.F-40 R-18



Objectives:

To introduce you to the fundamentals of the art of shooting a shotgun; to teach shooting safety and good sportsmanship; to teach and appreciation for the outdoors.

Materials Included in this project:

- Shotgun Manual 100. F-40 N-18
- Shotgun Record Form 300.F-1
- New Mexico 4-H Shotgun Greentop 400.F-40 (R-18)
- New Mexico 4-H Shooting Sports Greentop 400.F-2 (N-99)

Suggested tips for successful project completion:

- Review the project book, record sheet and greentop before preparing speeches, workshops or demonstrations.
- Make a check list to complete as you work this project.
- Participate in county, state and regional fairs.
- Enter project materials or demonstrations in the county, district or state contests.
- For the completion of the project, complete the record sheet and turn in a county record book to your local Extension Agent.

Suggested Activities:

- Give demonstrations or illustrated talks about shotgun.
- Set up practice sessions with other 4-Hers enrolled in the shotgun project.
- Talk to older 4-Hers on ways to improve posture and overall shooting performance.
- Attend a shooting competition hosted by a gun club in your area.
- Take a First Aid course to increase your awareness of safety.
- Visit gun shops to learn about different types of shotguns and ammunition.
- Volunteer at a local gun club.
- Help teach younger 4-H shotgun shooters.
