- Enter project materials or demonstrations in the county, district or state contests.
- For the completion of the project, complete the record sheet and turn in a county record book to your local Extension Agent

- Identifying small game.
- Improving small game habitats.

Suggested Activities:

• Give demonstrations or illustrated talks.

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- Exhibit posters at county, regional or state fairs.
- Volunteer to clean a wildlife habitat like a forest, lake, or BLM.
- Give a prepared speech or demonstration about the importance of wildlife to your club or school.
- Attend events to listen to experts in the field.
- Help others prepare a speech or demonstration about wildlife.
