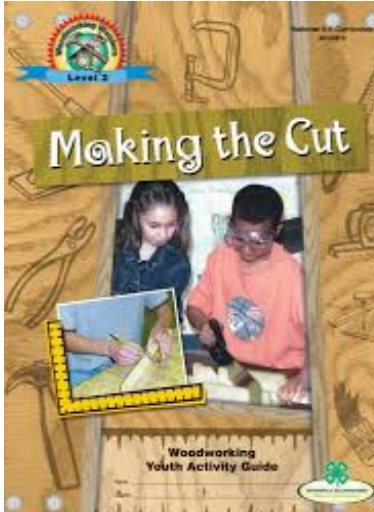




NM 4-H Woodworking 2 Greentop

Objectives: 1) To develop knowledge and skills related to woodworking that include identifying functions of tools, demonstrate safety techniques, learn about potential careers, using a bill of materials, selecting a project, understanding differences among species of lumber, types of screwdrivers, using a combination square, making a miter cut, sandpaper, how to use a pad sander, selecting a proper finish and selecting and caring for a brush. 2) To develop life skills which include organize by category, planning and organizing, relating to others, decision making, communicating with others, selecting an alternative; making the best choice and how to create your best image.
